

The Rosie report

Rosie has been able to report a little more about her journey. She did not spend long in La Paz but was impressed by the steepness of the valleys there. Ramiro and Ximena, Mik's friends who looked after her there for her overnight stay were very friendly and helpful and spoke more English than she had expected. The weather was unusually warm, so she did not need the coat she had taken. Luckily too, she did not suffer any altitude sickness which can afflict many people when they arrive there at 3600 metres above sea level. The flight from there to Riberalta was in a small plane (93 seat Avro J85), where her baggage allowance was less than on the international flights. Fortunately the excess baggage charges were only \$1 per kilo! She enjoyed the jungle scenery below and the snaking ribbons of the wide rivers

At Casa Segura, her room is upstairs in a two storey cabin, with a thatched roof. She has a double bed and a desk and is very comfortable there.

Her daily routine starts just before breakfast at 9 am. She describes the breakfast as being 'horrible bread – a round bun like substance, that becomes a little better when toasted, a yellow, very sweet, cereal or sometimes porridge. They have fresh milk, though recent rains have blocked the road from Riberalta to La Paz, which meant that milk supplies did not get through. She can make tea and coffee for herself.

She spends most of her time with the children and is kept pretty busy. It is school holiday time there at the moment, so they are allowed to watch more TV or videos, but she has been doing a little craft with them and colouring in – she took coloured pencils and colouring books with her.



It is an expensive time for Casa Segura at the moment, preparing for the new school term, which starts on Wednesday. Rosie has been with Mik to the shops in Riberalta to buy new white T shirts for the children – 2 each, and beige skirts/pants. She said that the T shirts only cost about 20 bolivianos each – that's \$4, but when multiplied by 17, it makes a dint in the budget. They also need to buy half a dozen or so school back packs.

So she's been taking the measurements of each of the children, to make sure they buy the right sized clothing, and then has to help label them all – 34 similar white T shirts in the wash need to be returned to the correct child!
