Pastor's Ponderings

I love the stories that the writers of the gospels put together about Messiah Jesus' birth. The Messiah that we greet in Matthew has no halo over his head. The writer shows that he comes from a dubious pedigree, his parents were an unwed teenage girl and an arguably reluctant father, and the pair of them are seeking shelter wherever it can be found. Our romantic notions of a cosy stable will have to wait a thousand years for St Francis to jazz up and launch us on our quest for cattle lowing, shepherds kneeling and magi bowing. I wonder if we are really prepared to welcome Messiah Jesus among us this Christmas season.

Here's a story to remind us of where Messiah is born. Once there was a monastery with a thriving spiritual community and a long history of commerce. As time wore on, fewer villagers visited for help. The sale of their wines began to dwindle. The abbot despaired for his community. "What should they do?" he wondered. They prayed daily for guidance, but the brothers only became more dispirited. The monastery itself reflected their mood, becoming shabby and untidy. One day the Abbot, hearing that a wise Jewish rabbi was visiting, swallowed his pride and went to visit the rabbi to ask his advice. The abbot and the rabbi talked for a long time. They spoke of their respective religions, and the fickleness of humanity. The abbot explained his problem to the rabbi and asked for advice, but the Jewish sage only shook his head and smiled.

As the abbot sadly departed, the rabbi suddenly rose and shouted after him, "Ah, but take heart my friend for the Messiah lives amongst you!" All the way home the abbot pondered the rabbi's words. What could he mean? Did the Messiah live in the abbey? The abbot knew all the brothers very well. Could one of them really be the Messiah? Was it possible? Upon reaching the monastery the abbot confided the rabbi's words to another brother, who told another brother, who was overheard telling another brother. Soon the whole abbey had heard the news. "The Messiah lives amongst us!" "Who do you suppose he could be?"

As each brother speculated on who the Messiah could be, his view of his brothers began to change. Brother Louis no longer appeared simple, but rather innocent. Brother Jacques was no longer uncompromising, but instead, striving for spiritual perfection. The brothers began to treat each other with greater respect and courtesy; after all, one never knew when he might be speaking to the Messiah. And, as each brother discovered that his own words were taken seriously, the thought that he might become the Messiah would cross his humble mind. He would square his shoulders and attend to his work with greater care and start acting like a Messiah.

Soon the neighbouring villages noticed the change that had come over the monastery. The brothers seemed so happy. Villagers flocked to the monastery and were energized by the spirit of the Brothers. And so the spirit grew and the monastery flourished. As each new brother was

The recent Presbytery Health and Vitality Consultation with Uniting Church Dayboro meant that a few of us had to move into overdrive to complete surveys and reports, but it was all worth it. We have a renewed strengthening of our relationship with Presbytery. If someone could offer their services to attend four Presbytery meetings a year that would be great. The Consultation Report has been circulated to everyone but if you missed it, please let me know.

My favourite part of the Report: There are not many congregations where the word "intentional" is as readily used to describe the character of their work as it is here at Dayboro Uniting. It is clear that the congregation puts energy into being actively thoughtful about why they do what they do and seeks to adjust accordingly. The congregation is more anticipatory than reactionary, with reference to the cadence of its life, and this clearly leads the congregation to be a meaningful witness to the love and mission of God.

We achieved top rating with our Spiritual and Community Health, Financial and Capital Resource Management, and Governance and close to top rating with our Mission and Vision. We are currently working hard on the latter and exploring ways we can be more intentional through all of our activities to invite members of our local community to become active participants in our life and witness.

I had a feeling we were a great congregation. It is good to have the evidence in writing! Thanks everyone.
