Pastor's Ponderings

It can be hard for churches in the 21st century to remain engaged in their communities, especially as the culture surrounding our society continues to change. Many churches retreat into their own bubble – interacting only with other churches and their own congregations and leaving the communities in which they're located totally outside the walls and fence line of the church property.

What can we do to remain relevant and even more importantly effective in our local communities? There are a few strategies that churches can employ. We can put on community events that are open to the entire community. We can engage in aiding those in the community that require assistance. We might consider getting involved in cleaning up the community (Clean Up Australia). We could share our talents in the broader community (Sunday Jam & Music Under the Stars).

When I lectured Church Growth earlier this century, it was understood that the primary needs most new people were looking for when joining a church community were acceptance and love. They were looking for a place where they knew they were welcome, & where they could develop genuine, loving relationships. We can plan lots of activities, but we must remain a haven where those seeking can find acceptance for who they are (not who we want them to become), & where they will find loving friendships & relationships.

We must be people who can say "come & see".

A review of our insurances.

Church Council has set up a new account called the UCD Community Welfare Fund. This is a fund to call on when an urgent individual need arises in the community, and we are able to help in a small way. It will be for Ps Dan or our Councillors to draw on after consulting with one other Councillor. Cash will not be given away but used to purchase food or respond to another need. Everyone is invited to consider contributing to this Fund if they find themselves able to do so at any time. Just mark an envelope accordingly and hand to a Councillor. We may have a retiring collection at certain services or events also.

Vacancy - Seeking a Volunteer

Role Description for UCD Representative to Dayboro Combined Churches Chaplaincy Committee

This role includes going to Chaplaincy meetings, usually in the afternoon, 3.15pm during school term. Meetings can last up to 90 minutes.

These meetings are usually every term and are held in the staff room at the Dayboro State School.

You will be part of the decision making process of how to raise funds to keep the Chaplaincy financially sufficient to keep the Chaplain attending Dayboro State School at least twice a week.

The Chaplaincy Committee also, when possible, helps out with Pancake Day and any Breakfast Club the Committee decides to put on for the students. There will be other occasions when you will be asked if you are available to help out.

When there are large events you will be expected to help out in some capacity with planning and help on the day/night. Some of the events include Movie Nights at the Dayboro Community Hall or Trivia nights, also at Dayboro Community Hall.

Pancake Day and Breakfast Club include making the Pancakes/Breakfast, cooking the Pancakes/Breakfast and handing out to the students. The school captains help out with these tasks as well.

You don't need to take on a specific role, i.e. Secretary, Treasurer etc unless this is what you want and are capable of doing.

Roles include: Chairperson, Secretary and Treasurer and Committee members. The Principal and Deputy Principal of Dayboro State School also make up part of the committee.

This is not a compulsory role, but one I think the Church should be involved in.
