Pastor's Ponderings

Impacting our Communities

I've been continuing pondering the ways in which we as a faith community, as pilgrims on the same journey, can impact the communities we are all part of. (Refer to May's Ponderings to consider what a community can be.) I think there is a real difference between simply growing a church and impacting a community. You grow a congregation with talent, great programs & charismatic leadership. We impact a community with compassion.

Congregations that are blessed with ample talent and dynamic leadership grow. Most of these churches are considered "good churches" and in many ways they are. But that doesn't mean their communities have been impacted — which increasingly for me is the mark of a truly vital church. In my thinking, it is impact that ultimately matters. This isn't intended to negate the significance or value of growing churches that are big. A topic for a different discussion is to discover how much church growth is through people coming to Christianity and those transferring into a church that just offers "more". I'm talking about a kind of impact that communities notice and are changed by.

You can grow a church on your terms - maybe. We can only impact our communities on their terms. If a congregation insists that everyone they connect with must do so on their terms, they may grow the congregation, but they won't impact the community. This is not about sloppy theology, going "liberal", or abusing grace. It's about a willingness to adapt our church's attitudes and behaviours, including receptivity to people who aren't like us, in order that more un-churched people may be willing to try us out and even come back. You grow a church by offering good programs. We reach communities by offering genuine & good relationships.

Why is Holy Communion important?

HOLY COMMUNION is one of two sacraments in the Uniting Church (the other is baptism). It is sometimes called 'The Lord's Supper' or the 'Eucharist'. At UCD, we practise an 'open table' - this sacrament is open to all who love Jesus a little and desire to love him more.

In Holy Communion, we experience much more than the taste of bread and wine and the process of an ancient symbolic act. At the Table, we gather with Christ and with all who have gathered with him down through the ages and with generations yet unborn.

The Lord's Supper is much more than an historical ritual to remind us of the life and teaching of Jesus in the distant past. By the power of Christ's Spirit, this same Jesus is with us at the Lord's Table as he promised: giving us not just bread, not just wine, but the very life-giving nourishment of God. Christ gives himself anew each time we eat from the loaf and drink from the cup, and 'feeds' us for our ongoing mission in the world until his kingdom is finally established on earth.
