

Pastor's Ponderings

The Sundays during March 2023 are all part of the church season of Lent. Lent is the six-week period leading up to Easter. The season of Lent is a very much a focus of our fellow pilgrims in the Anglican, Roman Catholic, and Orthodox traditions where it holds a similar level of importance as Advent the build up to Christmas.

While Advent is a celebration and a time of great anticipation, Lent is more frequently seen as a time of solemn observance and sober preparation for the remembrance of the death and resurrection of Jesus at Easter. Lent starts on Ash Wednesday (February 22nd this year) and runs until its conclusion on Easter Sunday (April 9th). Traditionally Lent has been a time for fasting or giving something up or abstinence. Just as we carefully prepare for events in our personal lives, as a wedding, or birthday; Lent invites us to make our minds and hearts ready for remembering Jesus' life, death, and resurrection.

These days, Christians around the world observe Lent in a variety of ways. Many from more orthodox and traditional denominations will still observe the fast strictly, beginning with the wearing of ashes on Ash Wednesday and abstinence of meat, fish, eggs, and fats until Easter Sunday. Others will choose to give up just one item for Lent, many modern Christians commonly choose a 'luxury' such as chocolate, meat or alcohol. It is also becoming increasingly common for people to give up other things in order to refocus their faith during this time; such as watching TV, or even social media. Many Christians also use Lent to read their Bibles and to pray, or by making use of the many devotional books and courses now available.

By the time this issue of the Bulletin has been distributed we will have marked the start of Lent with a Taizé style contemplative service. And the first Sunday of Lent will be being observed. Let me encourage you, no matter how you choose to observe Lent, keep the meaning in mind. It's a time to remind ourselves of the life & ministry of Jesus whom we call Christ.

News Flash from the Church Council meeting on 12 February 2023

Among other discussions, the Council members presented reports for their areas of oversight.

Various motions were passed concerning church activities including **Church Picnic** 15/4/23, **Dayboro Day Festival 2**8/5/23 - for the purposes of good governance and meeting our obligations to our insurers.

The results of the **National Church Life Survey** were tabled.

The date for the **Annual General Meeting and fire drill** was set - 26/03/2023 [Editor note: The date has been changed to 16 April 2023]

A discussion took place about the congregation purchasing an electric powered *lawn mower* for the "off week" during summer.
