Pastor's Ponderings

I've been reminded recently as I read Acts that the growth of the church comes about in more than one way. Of course there is "proclamation" whether to a crowd, small group, or the individual. But today, we neglect what Acts teaches about the church as an attractive community. We emphasise the church going out but do not look to God to send people in. But He still does as we can testify. A large percentage of our congregation are people who have been added, not from our proclamation, but because we are an attractive faith community for many (but not all) followers of Jesus and those who are curious.

Five marks of an attractive faith community

These emerge from a study of the apostolic letters to churches that are preserved in the New Testament.

- 1. Unity: This mark is first and foremost. In Jesus believers are all one (Gal. 3:28). The church is not a heap of individual bricks but a growing building that 'is joined together and rises to become a holy temple in the Lord' (Eph. 2:22).
- 2. Love: There cannot be love for God if we do not also love one another. First John makes this abundantly clear (4:20-21).

- 3. Caring: True love issues in practical care both in the Christian community and beyond it. Again, John says in part Dear children, let us not love with words or tongue but with actions and in truth (1 John 3:18).
- 4. Encouragement: We know from our own experience that there is much to discourage us along our way. We all need encouragement and in the church we ought to find it.

 Therefore encourage one another and build each other up (1 Thess. 5:11).
- 5. **Humility**: This is a beautiful grace, but rarer than it should be. Again Paul is right on target: 'Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in humility consider others better than yourselves' (Phil. 2:3).

Years ago I was taught this jingle, 'What would my church be, if every member were just like me?' It still challenges me. Does it challenge you, dear reader?
