Delving into Our History

TRANSCRIPT of a NEWSPAPER ARTICLE "The Brisbane Courier" Saturday 3rd March 1899

A picnic was held at Upper North Pine on Tuesday last in connection with the Presbyterian Church. Mr Berry kindly lent his paddock for the occasion, and about midday over 180 members of the congregation and friends assembled. When the good things so liberally provided had been partaken of, and games enjoyed by both young and old, the company was addressed by the Revs. D.F. Mitchell and James Barr, who had travelled from Brisbane to be present. Mr W.S. Laurie, who is in charge of the church, introduced the speakers, and referred to the necessity for a new place of worship, asking the people to give the matter their earnest consideration. Messrs. Mitchell and Barr spoke in terms of encouragement, and also urged the immediate erection of a new church. It is pleasing to announce that before the gathering separated a gentleman present offered a block of land upon which to erect the church. The proposition is being taken up most heartily, and in a short time a new building will be erected. On the same evening a tea meeting was held in the Samsonvale Church. There was a very large attendance, the capacity of the building being taxed to its utmost. At the after meeting the chair was taken by Mr. W.S. Laurie. Musical items were rendered by Messrs. and the Misses Skerman, Misses Duffield and Gordon, and addresses of helpfulness and encouragement were delivered by the Revs. James Barr and D.F. Mitchell. Votes of thanks were accoutred, on the motion of Messrs. W.C. Joyner and W. Fogg, to all who had assisted in providing tea, decorations and programme, & c.

This year, 2016, sees **115 years** of worship **in the current church building** (a good excuse for a celebration!). Pastor Dan's call to lead our congregation is a very significant occurrence.

The new church was built near and to the north of where the Dayboro Cemetery is now located (The Upper North Pine Cemetery was not opened until 1903.) The land was donated by Dan's great grandfather, William Nugent. It was completed and occupied in 1901. Protestant worship in the town had been going on for several years in private homes and the Orange Hall. As the congregation grew it was necessary to extend the new building in 1905 and it was moved to Williams St in 1924. In 1943 the vestry (now kitchen) was added and in 1961 the hall was built onto the church.

Pastor Dan is our 50th minister in the 115 years (another reason to celebrate!). Obviously some ministers had very short terms, and as we were part of Pine Rivers Parish once the Uniting Church was formed in 1977, we enjoyed the leadership of up to three ministers at one time.

But there is much more to our story.... our beginnings really happened **171 years ago**. In 1845 Rev Dr John Dunmore Lang, statesman, politician and Presbyterian minister gathered the flock at the home of Captain Griffin at Whiteside Station for the first known service of worship in the district. Out of this the Presbyterian community of Upper North Pine grew and eventually had churches at Samsonvale and Closeburn. Dayboro was formed into a congregation at that great picnic in 1898. Should we be planning an even bigger celebration for our 175th birthday in 2020?
