If you think you can attend to this yourself at home, Carolyn is more than happy to show you how to do this.




Our congregation is only as good as the people who make it.



Recommendation

Book: The New Testament in its World
N. T. Wright and Michael Bird, published 2019, SPCK.

Available from Koorong \$70 or Amazon Australia for about \$76 delivered



The publisher's summary about the book includes:

Your ticket from the twenty-first century to the era of Jesus and the first Christians. A readable, one-volume introduction placing the entire New Testament and early Christianity in its original context, written by distinguished scholar and author N. T. Wright.

An ideal guide for students and explorers, *The New Testament in Its World* addresses the many difficult questions faced by those studying early Christianity, including:

- What was the first century understanding of the Kingdom of God?
- What is the meaning of the resurrection in its original context?
- What were the Gospels, and how did they come about?
- Who was Paul and why are his letters so controversial?

Written for both classroom and personal use, this book brings together decades of groundbreaking research, writing, and teaching into one volume.

It presents the New Testament books—along with their subjects:

- Jesus and the early church—within the historical and social context of Second Temple Judaism and Greco-Roman politics and culture.
- The New Testament in Its World allows you to recover the excitement of what it was like to live as Christians in the first or second centuries.
- Features include: Surveys of each New Testament book that discuss their significance and provides commentary on their contents, along with implications for the Christian life.
- Major sections on the historical Jesus, the resurrection of Jesus, and Paul's chronology and theology.
- Up-to-date discussions of textual criticism and the canonisation of the New Testament.
- Frequent illustrations, maps, charts, diagrams, and artwork provide additional explanations and insights.
- A distillation of the life work of N. T. Wright on the New Testament with input from Michael Bird.
