Pastor's Pondering

I've been pondering what the next couple of years might look like for us as a congregation. Growing a church and impacting a community are not mutually exclusive. In fact, these two complex endeavours are highly interrelated. However, a strategy to grow your church may or may not have a true and lasting impact on your community. An intentional plan to impact your community for good may or may not cause your church to grow.

Way back when I was "Dean of Students" for a Bible College in Ipswich, I read the following question for the first time. I can't recall who first posed it, but it is powerful. "Would your community miss you if your church no longer existed?" That question has stuck with me ever since. Now I'm much older, and closer to retirement than I have ever been; so over the next few months I'd like to share a few observations the decades have afforded me.

Jesus consistently took his ministry to the people

The majority of Jesus' recorded ministry was in the community, not in the temple. The gospel accounts are filled with his interactions out among the people.

Today's leadership seems focused on building bigger (& ergo, to their thinking, necessarily better) churches. While that's not necessarily a bad thing, I've seen churches with hundreds, even thousands of people in them that make no dent on their local community because they focus all their time, all their energy, and all their finances, on what happens on Sunday morning (& evening), and on keeping the leadership prosperous and comfortable. We do well to remember Jesus' story of leaving the 99 to find the !.

It's important for us to intentionally leverage our time, energy, and resources, along with whatever favour God grants us, back out into the communities we represent rather than become fully consumed with those who already know Jesus. One last thought for June, it's not about how much or how many things you are involved with in the community, it's how effective they are. What is really

working? Let's be the kind of church the community would miss if we no longer existed.
