Sunday 5th May sermon (Paul): Our Emmaus Walk

Every one of us has at one time, or indeed for some of us, many times, travelled along the road to Emmaus. I know that I have been on the road to Emmaus most of my life. I've had lots of company on the Road to Emmaus. I've had many conversations along the way discussing, with anyone who'd care to accompany me, the ifs, ands, and buts of Christianity, of religion, and indeed of life. Along the way scripture has always informed my thinking. Augustine said, "Scripture teaches nothing, but charity and we must not leave, any interpretation of scripture until we have found a compassionate interpretation of it." It's time for us to reclaim the Christianity that has been high-jacked and resurrect compassion so that our faith can be a pathway to peace.

Sunday 19th May sermon (Paul): "Why did Jesus die on a cross?"

I suspect that question has been asked since the day Jesus died on a cross. Since our Easter services and drama on Good Friday it would still be fresh in our minds, I am going to talk about those events and Jesus teaching just before the crucifixion. But perhaps my answer is not what you expect!
