

DID YOU KNOW?

The first church in our tradition (it was Presbyterian) was built on land west of the Dayboro cemetery in 1900.

In 1925, this building was moved to the present site of the Uniting Church in Williams Street. It was moved by Fogg Brothers of Mt Samson most likely by bullock team. The reason for the move was to make the church more accessible for parishioners.

Given what happens on Dayboro Day, how clever was this move!!!

The area we now know as the kitchen was built in 1943 (or thereabouts) and the church hall was built in 1961.

We worship, therefore, every Sunday in a 115 year old building.

It seems that the first minister was a Mr Watkins who lived in a house at Samsonvale provided by the Joyner family. The second minister, Mr Dale, came as a missionary from Scotland. Apparently, he travelled between preaching posts in the area in a horse & sulky and used these trips as hunting expeditions. He used the results of these forays to feed pioneering families.

It looks like the Church pantry has been going for longer than we thought
